REGISTRATION

This year saw 82 players register with Mittagong Netball Club. This was down from approximately 110 the previous year but that was consistent with other local clubs who also had a drop in numbers.

We were able to form 10 teams (8 Junior teams and 2 Opens teams), with 10 players needing to be double registered.

Registrations opened in January and closed at the end of March with the timing of registrations as follows:

This was one of the first years that we didn't have to double up coaches on teams, which was excellent to see. The club is extremely grateful for the parents, grandparents and senior players who embraced a volunteer coaching role this season.

COACH COORDINATION

With the support of the coaching program, 6 of the 8 coaches this year, held their foundations coaching certificate. Mittagong Netball Club had the highest number of qualified coaches on the sidelines this season, which is a fabulous achievement. With the growth mindset of the club, these coaches can progress to achieve their development certificate, while encouraging any other future coaches to achieve their foundations certificate for next season.

The number of coaches expected to return next season is 4 at this stage, with a few coaches unsure. The club has had one senior player, Charlotte Mitchell-Knight and two junior players, Emily Eccleston and Amelia Camarsh, show interest to start their coaching journey in 2025, which is just so fabulous to see.

All Coaching equipment was returned successfully by presentation day. Coaches' bags are now prepared and set up ready for the 2025 netball season, along with ball bags and balls. Without knowing the number of teams for 2025, the bags were not replenished. This will need to be done at the start of the season.

A massive thank you to Mittagong Public School for their ongoing support with allowing Wildcats access to the school courts.

UMPIRE COORDINATION

The 2024 season has been a fantastic year for umpiring within the Mittagong Wildcats club, showing significant growth in participation, development, and teamwork across all levels.

We established a WhatsApp group chat for all umpires, allowing open and easy communication regarding game availability. This ensured fair and accessible communication for all umpires, enabling smooth weekly scheduling and fewer game-day gaps.

We have identified the following umpiring game requirements:

- Under 9s: These games require an adult or a teen umpire (over 16) with experience, as only one umpire is needed. This level provides a manageable environment for those with prior experience.
- Under 10s, 11s, and 12s: Ideal for new umpires to learn and build confidence. These games offered a platform for skill development, allowing beginners to gain essential experience.
- Cadets (Junior and Senior): These matches demand a more experienced level of umpiring to handle the pace and complexity.
- Ladies Opens: High levels of experience are required due to the competitive and fast-paced nature of these games.

The season was marked by fantastic support, not only from within our club but also from neighboring clubs, who stepped in when we faced occasional gaps. This collaborative spirit has been instrumental in the success of the umpiring program.



FINANCIALS: BALANCES

Mindful of our small opening balance at the end of 2023, the committee was very keen to improve our financial situation in 2024. We raised considerable money through sponsors, grants and fundraising and carefully considered our expenditure throughout the year, resulting in a profit of \$4385.11.

This year we developed a better system for keeping track of our finances month-to-month. Our Treasurer did a fantastic job of reimbursing committee members quickly where they had personally borne club costs.

We also purchased a Square reader to enable us to take card payments for uniforms, at events and online. Although the use of Square incurs fees, the ease with which we can process payments makes it worthwhile.

GRANTS

We were thrilled to secure two grants this year, each contributing to something truly special.

MITTAGONG RSL

Mittagong RSL gave us **\$2500** for our Winter Netball comp which enabled us to purchase new dresses and equipment for our players. They also provided us with free room hire throughout the year for holding our monthly committee meetings.



VEOLIA MULWAREE TRUST

Veolia Mulwaree Trust granted us **\$1000** to fund the *Hear Us Roar Training and Accreditation Program*. The aim of this program is to empower young aspiring coaches and umpires through training and accreditation. This will drive ongoing participation within the club throughout the critical drop-out years of 13-17. It will also allow the Club to elevate and future-proof itself by strengthening our coaching and umpire officials within the wider regional association.

This year we used this funding to hold two Umpiring Clinics hosted by the wonderful Kat Walker (SHNA Umpiring Coordinator) for all our players aged 10-15. Kat shared her expertise and made the sessions so engaging and informative. Our young netballers had a fantastic time learning the ins and outs of umpiring, enhancing their skills, and gaining a deeper understanding of the game. From these sessions, we were thrilled to welcome a number of new umpires to our ranks, with even more club members eager to begin their umpiring journeys in 2025. We look forward to nurturing this interest and supporting their growth next season.

FUNDRAISING

The Mittagong Netball Club committee has had a successful year with its fundraising efforts, which have played a vital role in supporting our club's ongoing development.



We held a raffle at Highlands Marketplace at the start of the season (led by Kate Compagnoni), raising almost \$1500. Prizes were very generously donated by local businesses. This fundraising was supplemented by sponsorships and registration fees and was used for our very successful end of year presentation, team bonding events and to update equipment. These resources are essential for ensuring our players have access to the best opportunities and can compete at the highest levels.

The role of fundraising with MNC is crucial to the sustainability of the club. It not only helps finance daily operations but also provides a platform for community engagement. A dedicated fundraising officer is responsible for organising and promoting events, identifying sponsorship opportunities, and fostering relationships with local businesses and supporters.

Looking ahead, we could try diversify our fundraising activities by exploring more online and social media-driven campaigns. These initiatives will help us reach a wider audience and secure the necessary funds to continue growing our netball program.

UNIFORMS

This year we purchased 25 new dresses and 15 new sets of bibs, as well as other uniform items to fulfill orders and have a small amount of extra stock on hand.



Some challenges with uniforms this year that will be considered by the committee for next year include:

- Having too many uniform options increases the Uniform Coordinator's work load and costs for the club due to minimum order quantities
- Having uniform hand outs over several weeks at the courts is extremely time consuming and labour intensive with stock needing to be continually transported back and forth.
- Having people swap their dresses from their allocation without advising the Uniform Coordinator makes it very hard to have accurate records of who has what
- Having dresses handed back via multiple channels, often without names, so we don't know who has returned what
- Not having all the dresses returned


EVENTS AND TEAM SPIRIT
